Participants arriving from abroad can fly to Ben Gurion airport in Tel Aviv. Participants who need a visa should make their own arrangements and contact the Local Organiser by e-mail if an invitation letter is needed. There is a rail link from Tel Aviv to Haifa. From the rail station in Haifa it is a short taxi ride to the Technion. Interested participants may arrange to travel in small groups from Tel Aviv to the Technion by taxi.
